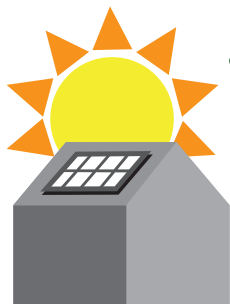


Medway Climate Change Progress 2021/22

- 34 electric vehicle charging points installed in 3 council owned car parks.



- 21 houses installed solar panels through the first round of the Solar Together Kent scheme, saving 16.5 tCO2e.

- 21% reduction (in 2020/21) of the council's carbon emissions against the previous year.

- In partnership with the community planted over 500 trees in 2021.

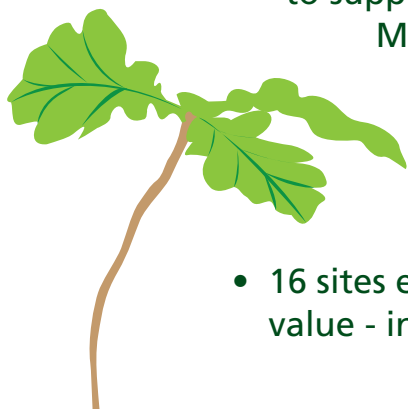


- Launched our walk to COP26 challenge - schools saved an estimated 5 tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent (tCO2e)
- We held our first Climate Change Conversation attended by over 60 people to share their ideas for climate change.
- Medway Food Partnership launched with a climate change sub group.
- £11million spent on LED streetlights - 3984 installed.
- Medway ranked 31st out of all UK local authorities (top 10%) for our climate change action plan by Climate Emergency UK.
- 137 Medway residents signed up for Home Energy Efficiency Grants.
- Medway Tree Fund launched and the first tree planted.

- £500,000 of funding received due to 6 successful bids, to support climate change projects across Medway.

- Medway started to deliver £12million energy efficiency programme in council buildings.

- 16 sites enhanced with bulb planting for wildlife and aesthetic value - in total an area similar in size to Gillingham FC's pitch.
