

ACADEMY CONVERSIONS

Background

The academies concept has been introduced and developed in a number of stages by successive governments. The first academies, prior to 2010, were sponsored by individuals or organisations. It was under this scheme that Medway's first three academies were formed; Strood Academy, Brompton Academy, and Victory Academy (originally called Bishop of Rochester Academy). The Academies Act 2010 introduced converter academies, allowing any good or outstanding school to apply to become an academy. The Secretary of State also has the power to make an academy order to force an underperforming school to convert to an academy. In 2011 free schools were introduced, allowing parents or other groups to apply to create a new school. This also introduced University Technical Colleges (UTC). The only difference between a free school and an academy is that a free school has not converted from an existing school.

*Total is 103 rather than 104 because Hundred of Hoo is an all-through school, and so appears in both the primary and secondary phase of the table.

There are 20 multi-academy trusts running academies in Medway, and 15 of these are based in Medway. There are three single academy trusts in Medway; Cliffe Woods Primary School, Walderslade Girls' School, and Chatham Girls Grammar School. Cliffe Woods and Walderslade Girls are looking at setting up multi-academy trusts in the future, whilst Chatham Grammar for Girls is seeking to join a new MAT to be established by the University of Kent, which already sponsors Brompton Academy.

The Pilgrim School is due to convert on 1 December 2016, and will go on to set up its own multi-academy trust. Deanwood Primary is on schedule to join the Howard Academy Trust on 1 October 2016.



Rate of conversion

The average rate of conversion has been fairly consistent since November 2010, following the commencement of the Academies Act 2010 in July that year. Once schools were given the ability to convert to academy status, both primary and secondary schools did so at similar rates.



Rebrokering of academies

Rebrokering is the process of transferring an academy from one trust to another. It occurs when an academy performs consistently poorly, and the Regional Schools Commissioner believes the academy would improve if it was put under the control of another trust. There is only one academy that has been rebrokered in Medway so far. Wayfield Primary transferred from the Griffin Schools Trust to the Primary First Trust on 1st September 2016.

Ofsted ratings

When a school converts to academy status, it loses its Ofsted rating. The time between conversion and the first inspection as an academy varies. The average time between conversion and inspection is 23.5 months for primary (based on 14 academies that have been inspected), and 21.4 months for secondary (based on



9 academies). The longest time is 46 months for primary and 35 months for secondary. The shortest time between conversion and inspection is 5 months for both primary and secondary.

Changes to rating after conversion

There are 14 primary academies where we have a record of the Ofsted rating before and after conversion (ratings for schools before conversion are deleted from the Ofsted website).

Of the 14 academies, 8 had a better rating now than at the time of conversion, 5 have the same rating, and 1 has a worse rating. Looking at the 47 maintained schools that have not converted, compared to August 2014 and now, 15 have a better rating, 26 have the same rating, and 6 have worse ratings.
