

Update on Street Triage July 2015

Background:

The Street Triage Service was a joint initiative between Kent Police and Kent & Medway NHS and Social Care Partnership Trust (KMPT). The aim of the Street Triage service was to enhance working relationships between KMPT and the Police and provide a responsive service to those in a mental health crisis. It aims to achieve improved outcomes for the individual ensuring services are provided in the right place, by the right person at the right time.

The Street Triage Service was based in the East Kent Crisis Resolution Home Treatment (CRHT) team based in St Martins Hospital, Canterbury and comprises a Police Officer and a Mental Health Nurse. The service commenced as a pilot in September 2013 and initially ran 3 nights a week on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. From September 2014 it expanded to 7 nights a week.

The service responded to referrals from Police Officers across the county who are considering a S136 assessment or need advice, support or assessment in response to a mental health presentation in the community.

The street triage service was established to achieve the following benefits:

- Improved response to those experiencing a mental health crisis.
- Improved experience of services for individuals in mental health crisis.
- Improved partnership working between KMPT and Kent Police.
- Improved education across agencies
- Reduction in use of S136 MHA
- Improved responsiveness by CRHT to referrals from primary care and A&E
- Improved length of stay for acute inpatient services through a more efficient use of CRHT Teams as an alternative to admission

Nationally the introduction of a police street triage services has been evidenced to achieve:

- Reduction in Section 136
- Improved conversion rate where Section 136 is used
- Improved assessment times
- Improved relationships
- Improved patient experience.
- Improved understanding of mental health issues across agencies

Where the service also responds to ambulance referrals other outcomes have been evidenced to achieve:

- Reduction in mental health attendance in the ED
- Reduction in ambulance deployment

Recent service changes have resulted in a review of the KMPT/Kent Police street triage model and approach. Work is underway with all CCGSs to scope a model that is more responsive to the local populations of East Kent, West Kent and North Kent.

The aim will be to provide an all age street triage service that responds to people who have presented in a mental health crisis through a report to either the police or ambulance service. It will provide triage screening, tactical advice and, where required, an immediate joint assessment by KMPT and Kent Police and/or SECamb in order to resolve an urgent mental health crisis.
